With 4.9 million African Americans diagnosed with <u>diabetes</u>, the risk of diabetes for them is 77% higher than white Americans<sup>1</sup>. The holidays are particularly challenging for diabetics because of the usual food celebrations with an abundance of sweet treats. This holiday season, combined with the <u>stress</u> of COVID19<sup>2</sup>, is expected to wreak havoc on the average diabetics' <u>blood sugar levels</u>.

"We've been working extensively with <u>Integrity Labeling</u> owned and operated by a Food Scientist, to ensure we are within FDA compliance and abiding by nutritional labeling guidelines." states Zabrina Horton, Legacy Pies and Desserts Owner. Kevin Harris, Co-Owner and Legacy Pies and Desserts Head Baker supports the charge, "We want to serve the diabetic community by promoting 'reduced sugar' healthier dessert alternatives." Both agree <u>Ticka's Less Sugar Sweet Potato Pie</u> is the first of many diabetic-friendly desserts to appear on their menu. Harris has a team of bakers churning out new recipes, all intended to help popularize healthier options within the Black diabetic community, the community most resistant to change.

During Thanksgiving week November 22, 2020 - November 29, 2020, Legacy Pies and Desserts is waiving their delivery fees. "This year we want to deliver Thanksgiving Desserts to your doorstep.
